Practical aspects of conservation and restoration of biodiversity, the current and future role of governmental agencies, NGOs and consulting companies in the field of biodiversity. Overview of rapid assessment methods. Case studies from Southeast Asia.

Content

Study visits to governmental agencies, NGOs and consulting companies. Rapid assessment methods in biodiversity inventories and planning.

Case study II Southeast Asia: Sustainable land-use and biodiversity conservation. From traditional protection/conservation to sustainable land-use in forestry and agriculture. Integration of urban and rural activities as a tool for sustainable agriculture.

Theme seminar III: Restoration of biodiversity.

Implementation

Study visits, lectures, practical training, seminars and oral/written presentations.
