Prior knowledge

Five semesters of study at the MSc in forestry programme.

Objectives

After the course the student will have basic knowledge of law and relevant legal areas for foresters and some skill in solving basic problems.

Content

The course starts with a bit of common juriceprudence and an overview of the forensic sources engaged when solving legal problems. Then the legal right of access to private land is dealt with, parts of the environmental- and EC-law as well as aspects of criminal law.

Implementation

The teaching is carried out through independant work in basic groups, lectures and seminars. The seminars are mandatory and prepared in the basic groups. The teaching relies on problem-based learning. Each student must write a memo. The memo is compulsory.

Requirements for examination

Individual examinations based on seminars and written memo.

Approved examinations according to above.

- If the student fails a test, the examiner may give the student a supplementary assignment, provided this is possible and there is reason to do so.

- If changes are made to this course syllabus, or if the course is closed, SLU shall decide on transitional rules for examination of students admitted under this syllabus but who have not yet passed the course.
