Objectives

Upon completion of the course, the student will have a basic understanding of resource allocation theory and the fundamental resource allocation problems of a society. These problems concern: What to produce, how to produce, the timing of production, and the distribution of the results.

Content

This course deals with the basic theory of market economies. The fundamental resource allocation problems and market solutions are studied. The theories of the household, the firm and their interactions are presented and discussed. "Market failures", imperfect competition and public goods are treated during the course.
