Content

The course comprises basic knowledge in biochemistry. The following sections are included: lipids, biological membranes, enzymes, biocatalyse, structure and function of proteins, structure and function of carbohydrates, regulation of energy metabolism, nucleic acids and DNA-technics.

Implementation

In addition to lectures, tutorial group work according to PBL (Problem Based Learning) will be included in the course. The course also includes web based exercises. In the course moment of subject integrated communicative training, with feed back and self evaluation are included.

Written final exam.
