Objectives

On completion of the course, the student should be able to:

- account for the anatomy, topography and physiology of the organ systems of horses, dogs and cats and to some extent of other common minor companion animals and ruminants,
- use established medical terminology,
- search for, process, analyse and critically review information as well as be able to present and discuss this in written form and orally.

Content

The anatomy, histology and physiology of the organ systems concerning mainly horses, dogs and cats but also other common minor companion animals and ruminants will be covered by lectures, problem-based teaching and through group work. The course also includes organ demonstrations and dissections.

Formats and requirements for examination

Passed written examination as well as approved group presentations. Approved participation in compulsory exercises, organ demonstrations, dissections and problem-based parts.

- If the student fails a test, the examiner may give the student a supplementary assignment, provided this is possible and there is reason to do so.
- If the student has been granted special educational support because of a disability, the examiner has the right to offer the student an adapted test, or provide an alternative assessment.

- If changes are made to this course syllabus, or if the course is closed, SLU shall decide on transitional rules for examination of students admitted under this syllabus but who have not yet passed the course.
- For the examination of a degree project (independent project), the examiner may also allow the student to add supplemental information after the deadline. For more information on this, please refer to the regulations for education at Bachelor's and Master's level.

Transitional regulations

- Exams: At least three retake sessions (renewed exams) must be offered within two years of the decision to cancel the course.
- Compulsory elements: At least one opportunity for a retake session must be offered within two years of the decision to cancel the course.

- The right to take part in teaching and/or supervision only applies to the course date to which the student has been admitted and registered on.
