Prior knowledge

Knowledge equivalent to English B from upper secondary school is required as from the academic year 2009/10.

Eligible students shall have 180 credits within social or natural sciences, of which 90 credits are within a particular major. English B (Swedish educational system), English 550 or higher TOEFL or English 5,5 or higher IELTS.

Objectives

The objective of this course is for participants to undertake a self organised study that will be presented both in written and oral form. Completion of this course will enable students to:

- independently conceive and develop a study
- use a host of methods to gather, analyse and interpret evidence
- write analytically
- present evidence in a form that demonstrates pedagogic reflection
- critically evaluate others course participants studies

Content

The course includes internal sessions with scientific theory, methods data collection, analysis and interpretation of evidence, scientific writing and oral presentation methods. Thereafter participants will undertake the study and write in concert with individual or group supervision. At the back end of the course, one or several seminars will be organised to enable course participants to make an oral presentation of their study

Lectures, approx. 15 h

Exercises approx. 10 h

Seminars approx. 20 h

Activities outside scheduled time:

Supervision approx 10 h

Self studies outside scheduled time:

Individual writing approx. 350 h

Total 405 h

Formats and requirements for examination

Approved exams, approved project work and approved individual and group exercises and sufficient participation in obligatory moments in the course.
