Objectives

After the course the student should have basic knowledge in fish biology, fish ecology and fisheries management.

Content

The environment of fishes, life cycles of common fish species, fish ecology, theoretical and practical fisheries management, rearing of fish for stocking, to create and manage fisheries management units.

Implementation

The course is conducted as flexible IT-based teaching given with reduced study activity (50%). During the semester the course will have meetings during five weekends.

Lectures, field- and laboratory exercises ca. 80 hrs

Self-directed studies ca. 120 hrs

Projects work ca. 200 hrs

Total ca. 400 hrs

Examination**Requirements for examination**

Seminars, written and oral presentation of project work. Written exam.

Passed reported project work and passed written exam.
