Prior knowledge

Successful completion of all courses in years 1 and 2, and participation in courses in year 3 of the veterinary program.

Objectives

The clinical teaching will give the student theoretical and practical knowledge and experience in dealing with the common medical diseases of the horse relevant to Sweden. Also included are methods of diagnosis, treatment and prevention of these diseases, and clinical competence in the technical aspects of case care in the veterinary hospital.

Content

The horse medicine course incorporates principles of medicine, clinical physiology and pathophysiology, clinical pharmacology, clinical chemistry and where applicable, principles of nutrition.

Implementation

The course is composed of a series of lectures, prescribed laboratory exercises, selected seminars and rounds, and rotation within the horse medicine hospital.

Examination

Requirements for examination

This consists of a written examination covering the knowledge base in horse medicine, and a practical assessment of clinical contribution during the clinical rotation. For full course credit both the written examination and satisfactory completion of the entire clinical rotation is required.

- If the student fails a test, the examiner may give the student a supplementary assignment, provided this is possible and there is reason to do so.
- If the student has been granted special educational support because of a disability, the examiner has the right to offer the student an adapted test, or provide an alternative assessment.

- If changes are made to this course syllabus, or if the course is closed, SLU shall decide on transitional rules for examination of students admitted under this syllabus but who have not yet passed the course.
- For the examination of a degree project (independent project), the examiner may also allow the student to add supplemental information after the deadline. For more information on this, please refer to the regulations for education at Bachelor's and Master's level.

This course is part of the section "Clinical Studies of sport and companion animals", of year 4.

- The right to take part in teaching and/or supervision only applies to the course date to which the student has been admitted and registered on.
