## **Objectives**

- To provide orientation on the veterinary profession and animal health care in Sweden and the EU, and on authorities, departments and organizations in the field of veterinary science
- To provide orientation on main features in ordinances and regulations concerning fields of responsibility in animal health care
- To provide knowledge of main features in the legislation on confidentiality and its applications in animal health care
- To provide basic knowledge in subjects of importance for the development of the student's ability to work as a team leader
- To provide information on professional associations and market conditions
- To provide knowledge of the avoidance of occupational injuries of different kinds and how to work in an ergonomically correct manner
- To provide orientation on the requirements for documentation in animal health care, case records and the preparation of case records
- To provide knowledge of, and practical exercises in, the handling of word-processing and calculation programs, global networks and electronic mail, to provide information on the most commonly used computer systems in animal health care
- To provide orientation on economic conditions for animal health care
- To provide knowledge of purchasing routines for material and medicinal products at Animal Clinics and Animal Hospitals
- To discuss the role of the animal health carers in contacts with clients/animal owners

### **Implementation**

### **Examination**
