Prior knowledge

The course is intended for Doctoral, Licentiate or Masters students. No special prerequisites are needed to attend the course.

Objective, including learning outcomes

The purpose of this course is to read and critically evaluate scientific papers of high quality, and to broaden the participants knowledge within the area of pathobiology.

Content

The course is in the form of a "journal club". Before each meeting, one selected paper should be read and will then be discussed during the two hours meeting. At each session, one of the participants will act as a "moderator" presenting the paper and leading the discussion. All participants shall however do their best to critically read and discuss the paper. Everyone shall act as moderator on one occasion. The selected papers shall be of general interest and not in a very narrow research area. Two senior researchers will support the discussion.

The papers shall be dealing with matters within the subject "Pathobiology" which generally speaking includes pathology, microbiology, food-safety, toxicology and pharmacology. All aspects of these disciplines may be discussed in the selected papers. Also methodology of general interest may be discussed.

Requirements for examination

Attendance to at least 7 occasions and presentation of one paper and moderating the following discussion.
