Objective, including learning outcomes

The overall objective is to elaborate on themes in the field of research methodology and research design. The aim is also to give opportunities for the participating

PhD students to discuss theoretical and methodological issues in relation to their PhD projects. Practical applications will be discussed in the context of selected field cases.

Content

The course will contain lectures, discussions and seminars and a visit to field cases.

In lectures, key concepts and themes in the interface of natural and social sciences research will be discussed, such as social constructionism, systems thinking, reflexivity, gender and development, and methodologies, such as action research and case studies. On completion of the course, participants will be better able to position themselves in the landscape of theories and methods and have improved their skills to develop a problematic issue into a research design and methodology choice.

Course components:

Part 1 (4,0 credits): Individual reading of literature. Lectures and seminars

Part 2 (2,0 credits): Field trip, group work and discussions.

Requirements for examination

Active participation during the intensive field visit and the lectures and seminars including studies of literature and presentation and discussion of a group work – in all four weeks full time work load.
