The requirements for attaining different grades are described in the course assessment criteria which are contained in a supplement to the course syllabus. Current information on assessment criteria shall be made available at the start of the course.

Prior knowledge

The equivalent of: at least 120 Swedish University Credits (SUC) including 30 SUC of basic (A-level) and intermediate (B-level) courses in Business administration or Macroeconomics; and the Core Curriculum in Agricultural Science.

Objectives

Upon completion of the course, the student will:

- be able to apply the information obtained during earlier studies at the firms, organisations, or community services that were investigated during the study trip,
- be able to perform economic evaluations of important issues for farming businesses and the farm sector,
- have an understanding for how economic considerations can influence both firms within the farming sector and the farming sector as a whole,
- be able to determine if different problems can arise for farming businesses and the farming sector as a whole,
- have a comprehensive knowledge of different actors within the farming sector and their role in society,
- have an understanding for production and consumption in the visited region.

Content

The course includes a study trip. During the trip, visits are made to farms with differing production conditions (including forests), authorities, and organisations related to farming, as well as processing and distribution industries within food production.

The students receive an assignment to analyse different problems, from the perspective of their own concentration within either business administration or macroeconomics, and then present their results for the course supervisors and their classmates.

Implementation

Study trip ca 40 h (compulsory)

Planning of the study trip ca 8 h (compulsory)

Seminar ca 8 h (compulsory)

Examination

Requirements for examination

Students are evaluated through written and oral final reports.

Participation in the planning and preparation of the study trip, the trip itself, an approved final report, and participation in the final report seminars.

- If the student fails a test, the examiner may give the student a supplementary assignment, provided this is possible and there is reason to do so.
- If the student has been granted special educational support because of a disability, the examiner has the right to offer the student an adapted test, or provide an alternative assessment.
- If changes are made to this course syllabus, or if the course is closed, SLU shall decide on transitional rules for examination of students admitted under this syllabus but who have not yet passed the course.
- For the examination of a degree project (independent project), the examiner may also allow the student to add supplemental information after the deadline. For more information on this, please refer to the regulations for education at Bachelor's and Master's level.

Additional information

The course is designed for students following the economy concentration in the agronomy programme. Those students, together with course administrators and the Department of Economics, are responsible for the planning, performance, and reporting of the trip. The students are expected to pay for the trip, with possible support from other sources.

- The right to take part in teaching and/or supervision only applies to the course date to which the student has been admitted and registered on.
- If there are special reasons, the student may take part in course components that require compulsory attendance at a later date. For more information on this, please refer to the regulations for education at Bachelor's and Master's level.
