Objective, including learning outcomes

To give an overview of different methodological approaches in relation to research questions posed within social sciences. Differences between qualitative and quantitative methods will be presented and discussed in general aspects as well as with reference to research within the cluster Landscape and Society.

Content

1. An introductory part of three lectures, presenting different methodological approaches and research questions in relation to ongoing research projects. The lectures will form a basis for the participants' design of their own research projects, which will be presented at the final seminar of the course (preliminary dates: November 1, 15 and 29, 09.00-13.00).
2. Based on the participants' reading of and reflection on the course literature we will discuss relevant methodological questions and problems together with the participants' tutors (preliminary dates: December 14, 09.00-13.00).
3. A final seminar where the participants present their own projects, including research questions, empirical basis and intended methodological approach. The presentations will be discussed and constructively criticized by experienced researchers and fellow participants. We will also discuss the roles and responsibilities of doctoral students and tutors in the continuing research process (preliminary date: January 24).

Requirements for examination

Through active participation (participation in all the five seminars is mandatory), and through oral and written presentations in connection with the different parts of the course.
